John Gerard Bruton

John Gerard Bruton was born in Dwyboynne, Ireland in 1947. He has served for a number of years as Minister of Finance, (of Ireland) Minister of Industry and Energy, Minister of Trade and Tourism; before being elected as Prime Minister of Ireland in 1994 until 1997. It was during his leadership, both as Minister and Prime Minister, that the Irish economy had undergone a major transformation; a period described by International Media, as the Celtic Tiger.

John was actively involved in the Peace process for the solution of the Northern Ireland problem, and he has indeed contributed tremendously, to the Peace Agreement (Good Friday Agreement) of 1998. Between 2004 – 2009 John became the Head of the Diplomatic Mission (Ambassador) of the European Union to the United States. He is currently serving as the Head of the Irish Financial Services Centre (IFSC).
