KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

Jan Ole Gudmundsen



Jan Ole Gudmundsen is a Senior Adviser in the Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, European Department. He has plenty of experience in European affairs and Norway's relations with the European Union. He has previously worked as a seconded national expert for both the European Commission and the European Parliament.

Gudmundsen is currently working in the Nordic-Baltic Section of the European Department with responsibility for foreign policy cooperation between the Nordic and Baltic countries (NB8). He is also responsible for bilateral relations with the three Baltic states.

Having talked at the same event in Oslo two years ago, Gudmundsen will provide an update on his thoughts with regards to the Brexit negotiations at this crucial stage, comparing on-going withdrawal negotiations against later negotiations on future UK-EU relations. He will also look at the EU perspective (concern for the integrity of the single market) versus the UK perspective (pragmatic solution), and discuss possible scenarios for 2019. Finally, he will reexamine the consequences of Brexit for states, individuals and economic operators.

Cecilia Lonning-Skovgaard



Cecilia Lonning-Skovgaard is the Mayor for Employment and Integration in the city of Copenhagen since January 2018. Prior to that Cecilia has been a member of the Copenhagen City Council since 2008. Cecilia has a broad work experience with managerial experience from both the public and the private sector, having worked for companies such as McKinsey, Carlsberg Breweries and Codan / RSA Scandinavia, and as Senior Director at Ørsted.

Cecilia Lonning-Skovgaard will speak about the challenges faced in Copenhagen when it comes to deprived areas, integration and making sure that more people are part of the working community.
