**Biography – Joseph Fazioli**

Joseph Fazioli is an Assistant U.S. Attorney in the Northern District of California, for the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), otherwise known as a federal prosecutor.

Mr. Fazioli prosecutes complex white collar and securities fraud crimes, as well as other federal crimes.

His trial victories have included obtaining the convictions of the founder of an international hedge fund, prosecution of an attorney involved in investment fraud, and a person who committed bankruptcy/bank fraud.

Mr. Fazioli attended the 2012 DOJ Securities and Commodities Fraud Working Group on behalf of the Northern District of California, and has received training at the DOJ's National Advocacy Center on investigating and prosecuting securities/corporate fraud and white collar crimes.

Prior to becoming a federal prosecutor, Mr. Fazioli was a litigation associate at the law firm Bartlit Beck Herman Palenchar & Scott, (American Lawyer Magazine's 2009 Top Litigation Boutique of the Year), where he worked on several trials (including the 2000 Presidential Election Litigation in Florida).

Mr. Fazioli previously served as a law clerk to the Honorable David A. Nelson of the United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit. He earned his law degree from Harvard Law School. Prior to attending law school, Mr. Fazioli worked as a Litigation Analyst for the Deloitte & Touche Consulting Group, where he participated in corporate internal investigations and assisted complex litigation.

He received his B.A. with Honors and Distinction from Stanford University, where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa.
