**a) Old Lisbon Walk**

*Take this tour and learn about the ancient civilizations that occupied the territory of Portugal over the years. Visit the Martim Moniz Square and the Mouraria. Be one of the privileged few to discover the breathtaking beauty of Lisbon as seen from the hidden terrace of Nossa Senhora do Monte. Admire Portugal's National Pantheon, the beautiful Saint Vincent Church, and take a look at the Feira da Ladra, Lisbon's picturesque flea market.*

*Go back in time as you wander through the Moorish quarter of Alfama. Visit Castle São Jorge Citadel, the ruins of the Roman Theatre and before ending your tour in Campo das Cebolas, admire the unusual Casa dos Bicos.*

**b) Tour of Sintra**

*Sintra is a real fairy tale! Sintra, 30 km from Lisbon, offers a foretaste of Paradise. The soft climate ensures a freshness and permanent existence of luxuriant vegetation making Sintra a deeply romantic and mysterious place. Stand out from the Town Palace, the Pena Palace and Moorish Castle. In 1995 the town of Sintra was classified a World Heritage site.*

*Privileged place of many European writers to drink inspiration to their master pieces - Lord Byron and Hans Christian Andersen.*

**c) City of Belem Tour**

*During this time Lisbon flourished with riches pouring into Portugal and saw the construction of great monuments like the Belem Tower and Jeronimos Monastery. Today these monuments and their surrounding museums are essential viewing for any visitor.*

*With so much to see, the Ajuda Palace and its ostentatious interior is often overlooked, but combined with the opulence of the popular Coaches Museum, it's the best place to see the regal grandeur of 18th century Lisbon and of the European royal families.*

*No trip to Belém would be complete without sampling the delectable Pasteis de Belém – warm custard tarts with a light crunchy casing. The recipe remains a secret and they are famous all around the world and enjoyed by the people of Lisbon who often make this a part of their Sunday outings.*
